PLEASE NOTE:

Non-resident applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.00 on a 4.00 scale and no less than a 'C-' grade in each and every prerequisite course in order to receive consideration for admission to the D.V.M. program.

Resident applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75 on a 4.00 scale and no less than a 'C-' grade in each and every prerequisite course in order to receive consideration for admission to the D.V.M. program.

Competitiveness in any particular year is determined by the quality of and number in the applicant pool for that admissions cycle.
