This two-day USDA Challenge Grant-funded workshop will provide curriculum and resources on animal bioethics to instructors of relevant courses in agricultural sciences and veterinary medicine.

Instruction will include development and effective use of tools for bioethics instruction.

Participants will be able to tailor materials and practice incorporating them into moral deliberation about ethical issues in animal agriculture.

Facilitators will provide guidance and constructive feedback intended to foster optimum course content delivery.
